These reader diaries need to be signed by parents every day as this tells the teacher that students are reading effectively at home.


P&C Meeting

Cooking Lunch The children will have the experience of cooking their own lunch with a range of ingredients to create the desired flavoured outcome for each lunch session. Each meal is outlined on the daily schedule

Making

Unfortunately during an after-school afternoon session in Club 1878 we don't get the necessary Sweet Treats time to make delightful sweet treats such as slices, they need an appropriate amount of time to refrigerate before consumption. As such, two sessions will be dedicated to children working together in the kitchen to make a Caramel Slice and Mars Bar Chocolate Crackles, these being favourites among many!

Dog Biscuits Children will be provided with the opportunity to engage with the wider community, by baking dog biscuits and donating them to the RSPCA in Ballarat - going above and beyond, helping the disadvantaged and homeless dogs of Ballarat. The RSPCA is constantly in need of donations such as dog and cat food, so instead of the children in Club 1878 making biscuits for themselves to eat we're encouraging children to think of those in need, those who can't make themselves yummy biscuits but would be oh so happy to receive them - dogs! Children will each receive a certificate from the RSPCA, thanking them for their donations. Two sessions will be dedicated to this activity, this activity having been a firm favourite for many throughout term two.

Bird Feeder And Boxes

Having a school situated among a large amount of trees and bushes provides the children with a chance to attract new birds and wildlife with bird feeders. We will be creating different shaped bird feeders to hang in tree around the school, created from all natural materials that will blend into the surroundings. Along with making feeders for the school children will also construct and design a bird feeder 12cm x 8cm x 16.5cm for home.

Wooden Clocks

Children will have an opportunity to design their own wooden clocks. The clocks are 20cms in diameter, the children can choose to paint or colour in the clock face to any design they choose, once complete the children will construct the mechanics and place the numbers on the clock face.

Dyed Photo Frame

Children will be provided with dyes to use to paint onto the canvas photo frames using different colours will create a magical result due to when the colours mix and blend it creates the effect of individual art work. The photo frames are 18cm x 14cm able to store a photo 11.5cm x 7.5cm

Wooden Snakes

Children will have an opportunity to design their own wooden snake, the snakes are 30cms in length, the children can choose to paint or colour in the snakes to any design they choose, once complete the children will have fun with the movement of the snake and bring it to life in their imaginary world.

Money Box Or Tea Light Desian

Each child will choose either an Owl money box or an Owl Tea Light Holder (first choice not always quaranteed) each child can choose to paint the Owl with as little or as much colour as each child wants to express. All porcelain money boxes and tea light holders will be supplied and coloured in with porcelain paints to create a semi-gloss effect.

Football Colours Day

Hot Pie lunch will be supplied. The children will be participating in range of ball based activities and games, with the focus on team and confidence building, whilst enjoying the fun of wearing their favourite footy team colours.

Outdoor Games

The children will be participating in a range of ball based activities and games, with the focus on team and confidence building.

Tic Tac Toe

Children will design and construct their own characters for their Tic Tac Toe game.

The children will use natural materials supplied and transform each piece to reflect each child's imagination. Once completed the game will encourage hours of fun with family and friends

Bow and Arrows The children will construct a bow made from a Paddle pop stick and design arrows constructed from cotton tips. During this activity the children will learn about resistance of materials while having fun

in a creative environment.

Kite Children will have the opportunity to construct and create an individual design using fabric paint for

their kites, once dry the kite will create hours of fun to enjoy outside

Science

During the day children will take part in a range of science experiments.

Session

All children will be encouraged to take part with all materials being used for the experiments being

based on the kitchen cupboard with safety and wellbeing in mind.

All bookings need to be paid in full prior to commencement as per terms and conditions of Club 1878 OSHC.

Vacation Care Days booking numbers are both minimum and limited; in order for the program to proceed Club 1878 OSHC require a minimum of 15 children per day with a maximum of 24, if you are wanting your child/ren to attend please complete the booking form and return it no later than Friday 9th September in order for you to be advised if the sessions will proceed. All invoices will be sent out once session dates have been confirmed.
