Dear School Community,

I am thrilled to announce that a new kindergarten will be built at our school.

This new centre will provide additional kindergarten places for the local community, while making drop-off time simpler and more convenient for some families.

We are working closely with the Victorian School Building Authority (VSBA), who will oversee construction works. We expect the kindergarten to be completed and open Term 1, 2026. The kindergarten will be operated by an external organisation with experience in running kindergartens. Once appointed, they will manage all enrolment, staffing and program enquiries.

We're mindful of any impact construction might have on our community, and we're working with the VSBA to minimise this. The VSBA will create a dedicated webpage for the project so that you can track its progress and get updates.

This is an exciting time for our school, and I look forward to sharing further updates and the design of the building once they become available.

FROM THE PRINCIPAL:

Welcome back to Term 3! We have an exciting and eventful term ahead of us, filled with enriching activities and opportunities for our students. One of these events is the school concert to be held at the Wendouree performing Arts Centre at the end of this term. Please keep an eye out for communication from your child's teachers regarding costume wear for the night.

PARKING AND DROP-OFF SAFETY around our school continues to be a priority. The police and staff have noted concerning driver behaviour during school drop-off and pick-up times on Dicker Street. Regular patrols will be conducted to ensure parking compliance. Please refrain from double parking and speeding. Particular attention needs to be paid when reversing as our children are little and often can't be seen. Also note that students must cross at the school crossing at the crest of the road, this is the safest part to cross. A gentle reminder not to park in staff carparks at the back of the Gordo. Gates are in place to restrict access to these areas, as they are deemed unsafe for students.

UNIFORM COMPLIANCE IS essential throughout this term. Our school uniform policy is compulsory, and we kindly request your support in ensuring your child wears the full uniform. If assistance is needed, please reach out to our office staff, who are more than willing to help. You can find our Uniform Policy on the school website and purchase uniforms at Beleza, Ballarat. Please note that the long yellow sleeve polo is only to be worn under the pinafore. Beleza have been made aware of this and shouldn't be selling the long sleeve polo in any other circumstance. School Council are currently looking at new options for the following:

EARLY STUDENT PICK-UP PROCEDURE

Parents requiring early pick-up of their children are encouraged to contact the school office in advance. By providing prior notice, arrangements can be made to ensure a smooth transition for the student and minimize disruption to the learning environment.

Thank you for your attention to these matters. We appreciate your ongoing support and cooperation in maintaining the health, safety, and educational welfare of our school community.

REGARDING MOBILE PHONES

Our school policy states that students are not required to bring them to school. However, if necessary, phones must be switched off and securely stored with their classroom teacher during school hours. Exceptions to this policy may apply under certain conditions, which can be discussed with school staff.

ONLINE SAFETY

Screen time and digital technology can help children build and maintain relationships and learn social skills. But for children of all ages, it's important to balance socialising online with opportunities for face-to-face socialising.

It's best for young children to interact with others face to face. This is how they learn about non-verbal cues, eye contact, body language and other social and communication skills.

- Risks include exposure to inappropriate content, cyberbullying, and privacy and data breaches.

FINANCIAL SUPPORT FOR FAMILIES

GORDON PRIMARY SCHOOL understands that some families may experience financial difficulty and offers a range of support options, including:

CAMPS, SPORTS AND EXCURSION FUND (CSEF) CSEF will be provided by the Victorian Government to assist eligible families to cover the costs of school excursions, camps and/or sporting activities.

CENTREPAY - If you receive a regular payment from the government e.g. health care card, pension card, sole parent, foster parent or Veterans Affairs Gold Card. you are eligible to set up a fortnightly deduction to go towards your child/rens school costs – booklist, excursions and camps. **There is no charge to you for using Centrepay.**

How Deductions are set up - A Customer can set up a Deduction in a number of ways:

Via their Centrelink online account, via MyGov, using the Express Plus Centrelink mobile app or by contacting the Agency. **The minimum Deduction amount for Centrepay is \$10.**






Ballan Library will be opening in 2025!
